ST JOHN'S WOOD SQUARE LATEST PROGRESS

We have now been on site at St John's Wood Square for two years and have made a vast amount of progress in that time. Since work began, over 125,000 m³ of material has been removed from the site, and nearly 27,000 m³ of concrete has been poured.

Almost the entire basement has now been excavated and the bottom level of concrete is very close to being finished across the site. The road that will run east-west through the development, is approximately 75% complete and by December it will be in use as an access route for site traffic.

The concrete frame for Block 5, near Ordnance Hill, is substantially complete. The next stage for this building will be to cast the stairs, with the façades and windows due to be installed later in 2025.

As of October, restoration work has now commenced on the former Riding School and you may have seen scaffolding being erected around the building. Specialist contractors, Walter Lilly, will be working on restoring the roof and the fabric of the building over the next 12 months including repairing, re-pointing and cleaning all brickwork, repairing the timber trusses within the roof of the building, replacing the slate roof, and restoring the clock tower. Alongside this, McGee are currently working beneath the building to construct a new basement.

WHAT'S HAPPENING NEXT: NOVEMBER 2024 - JANUARY 2025

THREE-MONTH LOOK AHEAD

The primary activities taking place on site over the next threemonths will be the continuation of the concrete works to construct the basement levels, the completion of the road through the centre of the site, and works to the Riding School (both restoration works and basement construction).

From January there will be a gradual increase in the number of

people working on the site as preparations are made to start constructing the building structures.

The table below provides an overview of some of the key activities taking place over the coming months and provides an indication of what to expect. However, please note dates may be subject to change as works progress.

Our working hours for the construction phase, as agreed with Westminster City Council, are as follows:

Monday to Friday	08.00 to 18.00
Saturdays	08.00 to 13.00

No work is normally allowed after 18.00, Monday to Friday, on Saturday afternoons or on Sundays and Public Holidays.

Where a machine operates with continuous or repetitive noise, we aim to work with respite breaks to limit the impact on neighbours.

Whenever possible, we will notify local residents of any variation to the above hours or work that might cause unusual disruption, such as out of hours deliveries.
