

THE YEAR AHEAD AT ST JOHN'S WOOD SQUARE

We are now more than two years into construction at St John's Wood Square and, over the course of 2025, you can expect to see significant changes on site as we move into a new phase of construction.

McGee will complete the major ground excavations and basement construction works by early summer, concluding this phase of the project.

From April, Multiplex, our delivery partner for the main construction phase of the project, will start work on erecting the pre-fabricated concrete frames for the new buildings. There are nine buildings to be constructed and this structural work will be the focus for the majority of the year, starting with Block 7 on Ordnance Hill.

In spring, Multiplex will also be installing the external cladding on Block 5, in the north-east corner of the site, which will give the first real indication of what the future buildings will look like at St John's Wood Square.

KEY TO SITE ACTIVITY

- 1 The main basement dig: excavations of the deep basement levels is now complete and the concrete basement structures will be completed by the middle of the year.
- The former Riding School: brick and timber truss restoration work is now underway.
- 3 **Building 5:** the concrete frame is now complete ready for the external cladding to be installed later this year.
- Queen's Terrace, with the construction of the final two sections of what will be the street level route remaining before it can be used for site access.
- is now fully supported by the permanent basement structure at the southern boundary.
- 6 **The west cofferdam works:** the excavation of the west cofferdam is complete. Concrete slabs are now being cast at the bottom of the excavated area to form the basement.

WHAT'S HAPPENING NEXT: FEBRUARY - APRIL 2025

THREE-MONTH LOOK AHEAD

There are four primary focus areas for the on-site construction teams over the next three months:

- Completion of the east-west access through the site
- Continuation of the restoration works within the Riding School
- Final stages of basement excavation and construction
- Progression of Block 5 and commencement of the external cladding

Alongside this, the Multiplex team will be starting to prepare the welfare and site accommodation needed to commence the next phase of construction.

The table below outlines key activities scheduled for the coming months, offering an indication of what to expect. Please note, that dates may be subject to change as the work progresses.

Our working hours for the construction phase, as agreed with Westminster City Council, are as follows:

Monday to Friday 08.00 to 18.00 Saturdays 08.00 to 13.00

No work is normally allowed after 18.00, Monday to Friday, on Saturday afternoons or on Sundays and Public Holidays.

Where a machine operates with continuous or repetitive noise, we aim to work with respite breaks to limit the impact on neighbours.

Whenever possible, we will notify local residents of any variation to the above hours or work that might cause unusual disruption, such as out of hours deliveries.
